The registered office is located in Watford, Hertfordshire. ADRA-UK is a registered charity in the UK and Scotland.

ADRA-UK partners with agencies in over 25 countries as well as projects in the United Kingdom. In 2007, we provided development and relief programmes valued at £1,69,723 pounds. ADRA-UK uses its resources effectively, keeping administrative costs down.

ADRA recognises the dignity that is inherent in each person and is committed to improving the quality of human life. It serves people without regard to their ethnic, political, or religious association. It helps those in need, especially those most vulnerable such as women and children.

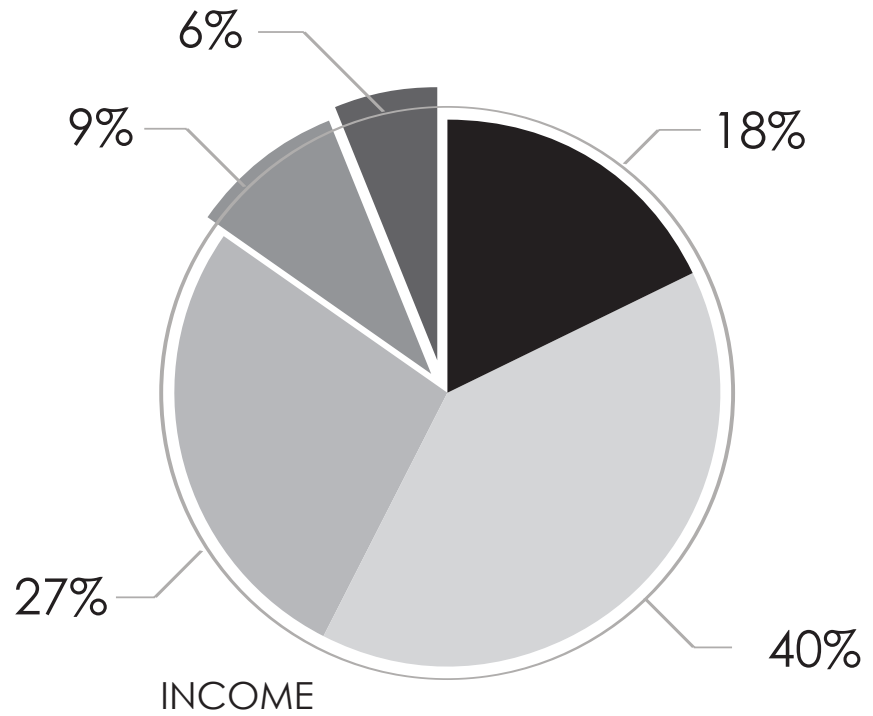
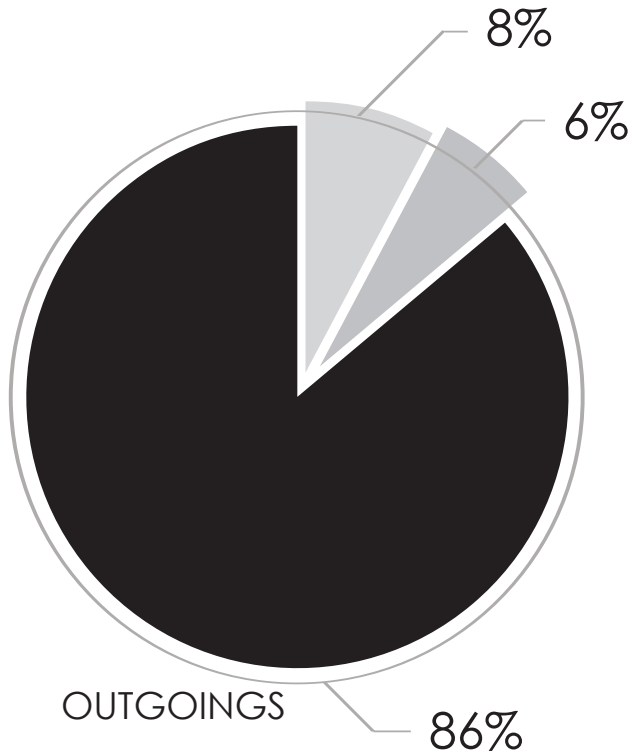

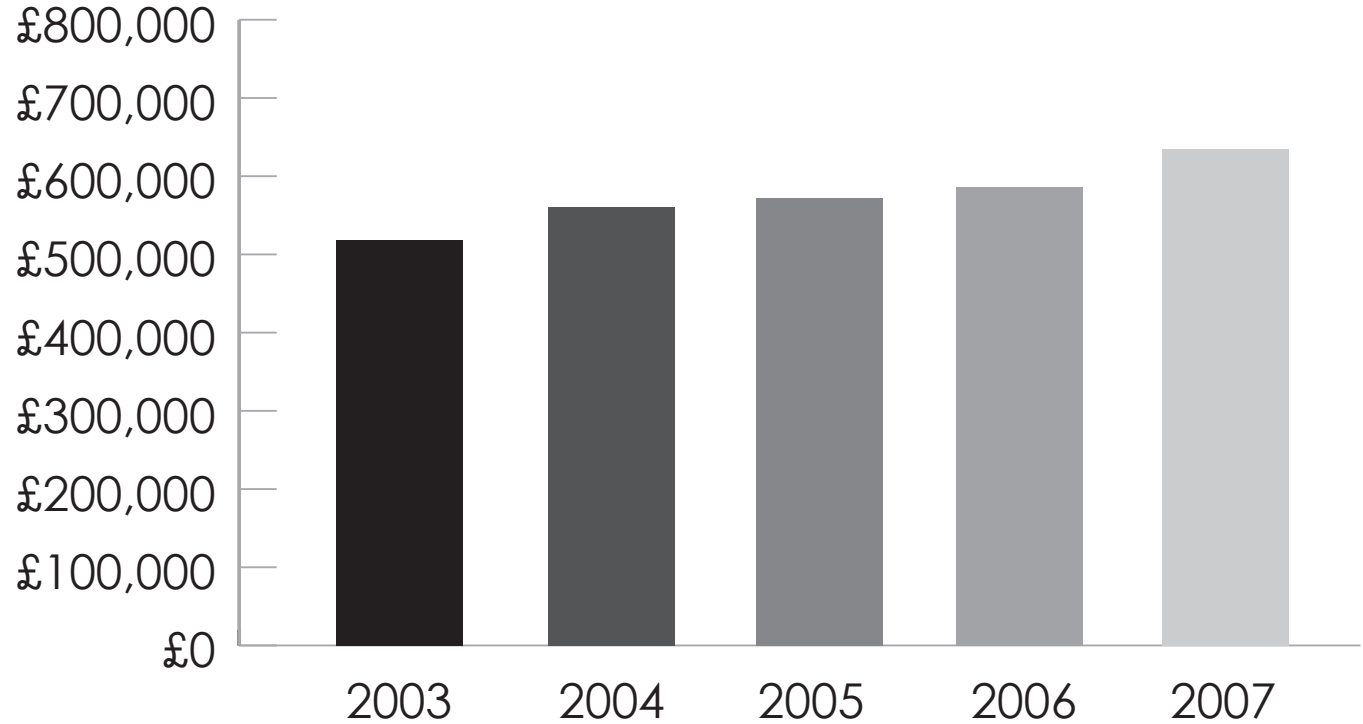
