Clean water in Zambia

Tukomane 'Happiness' village in the Chirundu District in southern rural Zambia is home to 2,500 people. Like most rural populations Tukomane is dependent on rain-fed farming and the villagers are trapped in a constant cycle of poverty and persistent hunger with limited livelihood options.

The only source of water for the community was a single 10-year-old hand pump that regularly broke down. Often, women had to walk 6 kms to the river 7ambezi to find alternative water.

Through the 2019 Christmas appeal ADRA-UK provided funding that supported the rehabilitation of the Tukomane water system. There are four solar panels that power an electric pump which feeds a closed water system. The rehabilitated water system now has the capacity to provide water to all the community and to provide water for over 3,000 goats and cattle.

The villagers now have access to clean and safe drinking water on tap for most hours of the day. This represents a substantial improvement in the quality of life for the villagers and their livestock. The women and children do not have to travel long distances to fetch water. The water system...

...will also greatly reduce chances of community members contracting water borne diseases and COVID 19 as they will have access to clean water which they can use to practice regular handwashing. The water system will also improve hygiene standards of all the beneficiaries. All the animals, which are a source of income for their livelihoods, will also have access to water.

Happy to Learn

Five-year-olds are famous for their noise, exuberance, and eagerness to learn. ADRA believes that every five-year-old should have the opportunity to play, learn and develop. However, in Northern Shan State in rural Myanmar, 5-year-old Ciang Suan Gin was denied these opportunities because he was born with a hearing impairment.

Ciang is not the only disabled child in his family. Two of his elder brothers also have hearing and intellectual impairments. His parents are farmers but the proceeds from the land and the animals they keep are insufficient for the family to exist. Both his parents often must go away to do casual work to provide for the family.





Because of his hearing impairment, his family and the community thought that little Ciang could not learn. ADRA's CASE2Learn project heard about Ciang and visited with the family.

ADRA is now providing basic education for Ciang at home with a sign language teacher. He is taught the national curriculum for 5-year-olds, and he is also provided with all the necessary learning materials. He is doing very well and is an intelligent little boy.

Signing Ciang said: "Thank you ADRA! I am very happy to learn A, B, C with my teacher. I want to go to school with my friends."
